Program Information

Eligible Students

The high school credit recovery and original credit program is planned for students enrolled in grades 9-12. Classes will be filled on a first come, first serves basis with priority given to 11th and 12th grade City School students. City Schools' traditional, charter, and contract school students, students who attend private and parochial schools, and non-resident students are eligible.

PROGRAM DATES AND TIMES

All sites will operate Monday to Friday from July 9 until August 10 at the following times.

- Period 1: 8:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m. (breakfast will be served at 7:30 a.m.)
- Period 2: 11:30 a.m. – 2:30 p.m. (lunch will be served at 11:00 a.m.)
- Carver Vo-Tech will be a **late start site**. 1st period: 11:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. and 2nd period: 2:30-5:30 (breakfast will be served from 10:30-11 a.m. and a late lunch served at 2-2:30 p.m.)

FEES AND EXPENSES

All fees are due at the time of registration. Payment is to be made by **certified check or money order ONLY in the exact amount made payable to Baltimore City Public Schools**. No cash or personal checks will be accepted.

Registration Information

Registration forms are available online at Baltimorecityschools.org/summer and at district high schools. **The forms require signature of the principal or designee *and* the school's guidance counselor.** Non-City Schools' students may acquire a registration form from the nearest public high school or from the district website.

- All registration forms must be completed with signatures before reporting to the registration site.
- At registration, students expecting to graduate in the summer must present a copy of their transcript, which includes credits earned, HSA scores and service learning hours.

Cancelation of Courses

City Schools reserves the right to cancel courses with insufficient student enrollment at a site. In the event of course cancellation, the student may change courses, change sites, or request a refund.

Student Attendance

Summer school students shall attend class unless prevented by severe illness, death in the family, or court-related matters. Summer school students who miss more than 3 days of a class risk receiving a failing grade for that class. Arriving at school on time is vital to learning. Three tardies will constitute one absence. Students whose attendance or punctuality do not meet the above requirements risk being withdrawn from the summer school program. This will be done after the school contacts parents or guardians by phone or mail, offers counseling and/or arranges a parent conferences. Refunds **will not** be given in this situation.

Refund Policy

Refunds will **only** be offered to students whose classes were canceled due to insufficient enrollment or who have a documented, extenuating circumstance (accident, illness, death of immediate family member) that led to the student's inability to attend the program at all. There will be **no refunds for students who have been withdrawn due to chronic absences, lateness, or offenses against the Code of Conduct**. All refund requests must be made by August 10, 2018. **Refund requests made after Aug. 10, 2018 will be denied.**

Students with Specific Needs

Students with an active IEP or 504 Plan will be provided reasonable accommodations inclusive of the provision of an IEP required temporary adult aide and/or nurse. English Learners will also be provided reasonable accommodations based on student's EL Plan.

First Day of Instruction

On the first day of instruction, students should report to class at least 15 minutes prior to the start of class.

Dress Code

Baltimore City Public Schools dress code is in full effect during the duration of summer school. Students who are dressed inappropriately will be sent home.

Summer Meals

Both breakfast and lunch are provided. Students will not be permitted to leave campus for summer meals.

Transportation

Enrolled students will be provided MTA bus tickets to and from summer school sites. Students will receive their MTA bus tickets beginning the first day of summer school and will receive 2 tickets per day thereafter (one ticket to get home and one to get back to school the next day).

Student Behavior

Summer programs are not mandated by the state. Therefore, the provisions in the Code of Conduct that cover the number of suspension days are not applicable. Expectations for student behavior are outlined in the Code of Conduct. Students **must** adhere to the rules and regulations set forth in the Code of Conduct. Students may be automatically withdrawn from summer school due to consistent infractions of the Code of Conduct. If a student is withdrawn due to inappropriate behavior a refund **will not** be given.

Who to Contact and How to Apply?

With the assistance of the student's principal and or/guidance counselor, eligible students must complete the registration form and bring it to the high school site student wishes to attend. If you have further questions please contact:
