- Public comment will be taken at this meeting. Any members of the public interested in participating can e-mail Lindsey Anderson at leanderson@bcps.k12.md.us between 5:30 – 7:30 PM on December 2. The time limit for oral testimony at these meeting is 5 minutes. Everyone who signs up in the designated time period may provide public comment. Members of the public will need to provide their name, email address, telephone number, school/civic/community affiliation, agenda topic, and the format to be used: commenting live, submitting a video, or an email of no more than 650 words to be read. If submitting a video, please attach the video to the email. The 5 minute time limit applies to groups as it does to individuals.
- Members of the public joining the call are asked to mute their phones upon joining. Anyone joining who fails to do so may be muted by the call moderator or removed from the call.
- The maximum capacity for the teleconference is 350 people.

- Translation services for public comment participants for the following languages (Spanish, French, Arabic, Swahili, Tigrigna) will be offered for this meeting.
- The Board may convene in a closed session, in accordance with the Maryland Annotated Code, General Provisions Article, §3-101. Before any closed meeting is convened, the presiding officer will publicly identify the section or sections of the Open Meetings Act authorizing the closed meeting.
