This four-course sequence prepares students for industry certification and college credit in one of two areas: Homeland Security Scientist or Information/ Communications Technology. Students focus on protecting against threats to public safety through effective communication, preparedness, detection, prevention, response and recovery. All areas conclude with a capstone project mentored by industry partners.

Courses include: Foundation of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness, Homeland Security Science, Advanced Geographic Information Systems and Remote Sensing, and a Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness Internship.
